This course reimagines Al alignment through African ethical frameworks. Moving beyond technical definitions, it asks: Whose values shape Al? and What futures do we want it to serve?

Participants explore data colonialism, value conflict, and epistemic injustice, while engaging tools like Ubuntu, design justice, and Afrofuturism. Grounded in African realities, this course equips learners to build Al systems aligned with justice, dignity, and community wellbeing.







All formats are available **online** or **inperson**, and can be adapted for teams, organisations or mixed cohorts. Each session is practical, discussion-rich, and grounded in real-world case studies.

### **Course Structure**

The African Al & ALignment course is made up of eight 1-hour modules, designed to be flexible around your pace and schedule. Whether you're looking for a deep dive or a fast-track, we offer multiple formats to suit your needs:

#### **Extended Track (8 Weeks)**

One session per week, ideal for busy professionals looking to integrate learning into their schedule.

#### **Standard Track (4 Weeks)**

#### **Intensive Track (1 Week)**



- **4 Governance, Participation & Policy** Explore African Al policy frameworks and practice participatory governance to imagine inclusive regulation and grassroots tech accountability.
- Surveillance, Resistance & Rights
  Critique the expansion of Al-powered
  surveillance in South Africa and defend the
  ethical right of communities to resist
  harmful tech.
- Afrofuturism & Design Justice
  Envision liberatory Al systems through
  Afrofuturism, speculative ethics, and
  community-centred design that reclaims
  the future for African values.
